UND Football also hosted 6 home games this year plus and playoff game, including the opportunity to host rival, NDSU and win the game for the first time in 20 years with an adrenaline filled rush of the field by the crowd! We are fortunate to have been able to host 376 events this year and drive over 22 million dollars in economic impact to the greater Grand Forks region.



While, we were unable to end the year at a budgeted profit,
Alerus Center was able to effectively serve the mission of driving significant economic impact
and quality of life through events and entertainment and was able to continue to fill hotels
and restaurants. As always, our success would not be possible without such a talented




The Alerus Center roof is being refinished to alleviate flooding issues. The new black roof will also absorb heat and help lower heating costs in the winter.

SUCCESS FOR BERT AND DIRT

Bert Kreischer was the first comedian to play the Alerus Center stage since Jo Koy in 2019. Kreischer had the highest gross sales and tickets sold of any comedian in venue history. Similarly, the PBR Pendleton Whiskey Velocity Tour returned for its third consecutive year. Sales for the tour continued to grow, culminating in the tour's first sold out show in Grand Forks. PBR has increased their capacity for 2024.



UND FOOTBALL PLAYOFF GAME

2023 was a banner year for the Alerus Center with regard to UND Football. The Alerus Center hosted 7 UND Football home games including a first round playoff game against Sacramento State. The high point of the Fighting Hawks season was the 49-24 win over rival North Dakota State in front of a full home crowd. The win ended with fans rushing the field. In 2024, Alerus Center looks forward to hosting 7 UND regular season home games.



Other notable events in 2023 included Kenny Chesney with Kelsea Ballerini. Whiskey Myers, the return of the Happy Harry's Pork & Brew and Fight the Frost, Anthrax, Cirque Musica, and Hairball.

The evening raised more than \$451,000 for Altru's NICU and drove an additional \$52,000 in direct spending to the community of Grand Forks.



Each year, Alerus Center hosts and participates in several charitable events. In 2023, Alerus Center competed in the Grand Forks Chamber of Commerce Golf Tournament and the Listen Center Golf Tournament.

Moreover, Alerus Center continued to host & participate in drive-thru holiday meals for the Grand Forks Senior Center, day care tours, Family Voices of ND Trunk or Treat, and other similar events.







WHAT A [VENUE] GOTTA DO

One of Alerus Center's lowest moments in 2023 was the postponement of the Jonas Brothers concert originally scheduled for November 17th. The OVG 360 staff, wanting to spread some cheer for the holidays, worked with Cirque Musica and Hairball to provide free tickets to Jonas Brothers buyers. Nearly 1,000 combined tickets for Cirque Musica and Hairball were gifted to customers. Both shows received rave reviews from those who attended and the tours were thrilled to welcome hundreds of new faces presumably seeing their acts for the first time.

2023 was scheduled and budgeted to have a net operating income of over \$100,000. Unfortunately, in a cyclical business largely driven by the touring market and conference center event rotations, Alerus Center ended the year net operating loss of approximately \$339,000.00. However, we are thankful for a strong event load, successful events, and strong economic impact. Additionally, the 0.75% hospitality tax supporting the Alerus Center's capital fund was extended.



As we look over another successful year and look forward into the foreseeable future, Oak View Group remains optimistic that Alerus Center will continue to serve its mission. In 2024, we are excited to host Jurassic Quest, Toby Mac's "Hits Deep Tour", Journey with very special guest Toto, Chris Stapleton's "All American Road Show", Kane Brown's "In The Air Tour", Toughest Monster Truck Tour, Professional Bull Riders, and more as well as 7 regular season University of North Dakota Fighting Hawks football games in the arena. We are also set to make Alerus Center history in August by hosting the first-ever "double night" concert with two performances by Zach Bryan. In the conference center, we will host more than 10 conventions, 20 weddings, 16 consumer shows, and over 130 meetings. Oak View Group looks forward to continuing to drive economic impact and enhance the quality of life through hosting exciting and diverse events for the Grand Forks community and region that we love so much.
